So you're ready to dive into the warm, cozy waters of clean romance?

YAY! Because this genre is absolutely booming! Readers can't get enough, and it's one of the easiest romance subgenres to break into with new AI pen names.

But first, let me give you the story behind my journey.

I first jumped into this genre almost six months ago, after creating (yet another lol) brand new AI pen name.

This means that none of these books were written by me as it wasn't a genre I was personally interested in. That is until a few author friends told me just how profitable it was and how it was continuing to skyrocket on Amazon.

So, this new AI-pen name in clean/sweet romance really started off as a test. Since we can use Claude to quickly write books in as many genres as possible to test the waters, it only took a couple of weeks to have a couple new books ready to publish, a pen name registered (domain + FB page only) and I was ready to go!

But before I started writing with Claude, I did a deep dive using a few different tools (Publisher Rocket, Book Beam, etc) just to see what direction I should take.

**I quickly found out that later-in-life romance is massively undersaturated and in VERY high demand.**

These readers (40+) want stories of second chances and characters they can actually relate to. So we're talking mature adults, 40+, finding love after life's real twists and turns.

This was completely different from the 25-year-old college student audience I was originally planning to target.

But boy, am I glad I pivoted! Here's what happened...

## Month 1-2: Testing the waters

- 2 books published using the strategies in this guide
- Focused on 45+ heroines in professional settings (this was KEY!)
- Started at \$0.99 in Kindle Unlimited for book 1 only
- **Made \$327 first month** (not bad for a test with zero ad spend!)

## Month 3-4: Found my groove

- Added 3 more books (total of 5)
- Set up 4 preorders (2-4 months out - this created anticipation!)
- Started a new series in "paranormal romance comedy with mid-lifers" (yes, that's a thing!)
- Revenue jumped to **\$1,634 in month 4**

## Month 5: Yesss!

- 9 books total across 3 series
- Email list of just over 620 subscribers (these people are GOLD!)
- Ran a couple giveaways through BookFunnel which was a wild success
- **\$3,247 in revenue!**

The best part? These readers are SO incredibly loyal. These 40+ women have disposable income and they're not afraid to spend it on books they love.

Everyone says "steamy sells" but clean romance readers are actually way less saturated and MUCH more loyal. When you nail what they want, they buy everything you write.

I almost targeted younger readers like every other romance author. Thank goodness I didn't! The 42-year-old average reader statistic (you'll see it in this guide) completely shifted my strategy.

# *Your Target Audience*

Who's buying clean romance?

- Average age: 42 years old
- 78% women
- They read 4+ books per month (Voracious readers!)
- They have disposable income
- They want emotional connection, not steamy scenes
- They love series more than standalone books (77% better performance!)

## **What they're actually craving:**

- Professional heroines who have their lives together
- Realistic relationship challenges (not teenage drama!)
- Characters dealing with real midlife stuff (divorce, empty nest, career changes)
- Emotional intimacy that makes them cry happy tears
- Heroes who are grown men, not emotionally stunted boys

*What you're going to do:*

Write for smart, successful women in their 40s & 50's

Focus on **emotional intimacy** instead of physical heat

Plan for **series from day one**. Seriously, standalone books tank

Publish quickly (I recommend stockpiling 2-3 books before launching)

Pick 2-3 tropes to blend. Some hot ones right now:

- Second-Chance Love (divorcees, widows)
- Single Parent & Blended Families
- Enemies to Friends to Lovers
- Reunion/Old Flame Rekindled
- Workplace Romance (professional adults reconnecting)
- Empty Nesters Finding Love Again

# *Character Types That Sell*

While everyone's writing about bartenders and college students, clean romance readers want to see women like THEM – professionals with careers and real responsibilities.

## **Medical Romance**

*Why medical settings work so well:*

- Built-in life-and-death emotional stakes (without needing bedroom scenes)
- Professional competence is incredibly attractive to mature readers
- Natural healing metaphors that resonate deeply
- Realistic workplace drama they can relate to

*My winning medical character types:*

- Emergency room doctors (calm under pressure, literally save lives)
- Pediatricians (nurturing, work with families, community-minded)
- Nurses (competent, caring, often underestimated – readers love this!)
- Medical researchers (brilliant, focused on solving important problems)
- Rural/small-town doctors (serve community, know everyone, old-fashioned values)

## *Example*

47-year-old pediatrician who's devoted her life to other people's children meets 45-year-old ER doctor during a medical crisis.

They clash over treatment approaches but slowly learn to respect each other's expertise. Set in a small hospital facing budget cuts.

# *Character Types That Sell*

## **CEO/Business Romance**

Make them ethical, competent leaders - NOT the "asshole billionaire" trope. Clean romance readers absolutely hate that.

My successful business character archetypes:

- Family business owners (generational responsibility, community ties)
- Ethical CEOs (put employees first, social responsibility matters)
- Management consultants (smart problem-solvers, travel for work)
- Small business owners (bookstore, bakery, local services)
- Corporate lawyers (justice-minded, struggling with work-life balance)

Tropes that are making me money:

- Fake dating for business events (charity galas, family dinners)
- Business rivals who respect each other (competing companies, but ethical competition)
- The turnaround specialist (brought in to save failing company)
- Workplace collaboration (merger negotiations, crisis management)
- Family business succession (taking over from aging parents) - great for series setup!
- Past love reunited (childhood sweethearts find each other again etc)

## *What's Selling*

### **Professional Development Romance (Surprise Success!)**

NO teacher/student romance! Clean romance readers find this inappropriate.

Instead:

Safe education scenarios that work:

- Professional conferences (continuing education, industry training)
- Adult education settings (career changers, community college)
- Corporate training (expert brought in to teach professionals)
- Research collaboration (working on professional projects together)

## *Realistic Midlife Conflicts That Readers Devour*

- Aging parents needing care while starting new relationship
- Adult children's opinions about parent's love life
- Financial considerations (retirement planning, college tuition still being paid)
- Health scares that put life in perspective
- Career transitions (early retirement, downsizing, complete career change)
- Blended family dynamics (his kids, her kids, potential grandchildren)

These readers see themselves in these stories! They're not fantasizing about being 25 again...they want their **current life stage represented** and **celebrated**.

# *Trope Stacking*

Trope stacking is when you combine at least **two or more reader-favorite tropes** into a single story. It's a great way to get more readers very quickly. I aim to include at least 3 tropes.

## **1: Empty Nest + Business Romance + Age Gap**

- 48-year-old woman whose kids just left for college meets 42-year-old business consultant
- Rediscovering who she is outside of motherhood

## **2: Second Chance High School Sweethearts + Forced Proximity + Small Town**

- Reunite at class reunion/funeral/when one returns to hometown
- Real history, real hurt, real forgiveness required
- Both have lived full lives, bring wisdom to new relationship
- My example: Divorced pediatrician returns home, reconnects with now-widowed high school boyfriend who runs family hardware store

## **3: Widow/Widower + Fake Dating + Holiday Setting**

- Widowed parent needs "date" for family Christmas, fake relationship becomes real (really popular trope/theme but put a unique twist on it!)
- Gentle approach to grief, family dynamics, seasonal warmth

## **4: Midlife Career Change Romance + Fish out of Water + Enemies/Rivals to Lovers**

- Corporate burnout leads to complete life reinvention
- Meets someone in new field who supports their dreams
- Professional reinvention + personal renewal
- My example: Burned-out corporate lawyer opens small-town bakery, meets local food critic

# *Themes That Resonate*

## **Professional Competence**

- Readers LOVE seeing women who are excellent at their jobs
- Show expertise, problem-solving, leadership
- Avoid "damsel in distress" scenarios completely

## **Realistic Family Dynamics**

- Adult children with opinions about parent's love life
- Blended family challenges and successes
- Grandparent relationships and wisdom
- Ex husband who tries to get in between them

## **Community Connection**

- Small towns where everyone knows everyone
- Professional settings with tight-knit teams
- Volunteer work and civic involvement

## **Personal Growth**

- Learning to prioritize own happiness
- Learning to trust again
- Overcoming past hurts through new love
- Balancing independence with partnership

# Cover Design Overview

Your cover sells your book before anyone reads the blurb. After testing different styles, I've discovered clean romance has very specific visual requirements:

## Visual Must-Haves:

- Illustrated covers (60%+ of bestsellers use them)
- Soft pastel colors: pink, lavender, mint green, powder blue
- Fully clothed characters in wholesome poses or just typography
- Happy, smiling faces (no sultry looks)
- Everyday settings: cafes, bookshops, small towns

## Typography Rules:

- Script/handwritten fonts for intimacy
- Clean serif fonts for timeless appeal
- Title must be readable at thumbnail size

## Popular Visual Elements:

- Cliffhangers: Mild tension, never cruel manipulation
